

Year 5: Summer Term 2024

ENGLISH	MATHS
<p>In Summer 1, we will continue to read 'Journey to the River Sea' which links with the geography this term. Children will be introduced to writing workshops where their writing is constantly edited and improved throughout the lesson which will support the cohesion of their writing. The children will be writing a debate on the life decisions of the main character and they will end the unit on a narrative of their own creation based on the structure of the novel.</p> <p>In Summer 2, we will be reading 'The Executioners Daughter'. During this last term, children will be expected to experiment with a range of skills as they continue to consolidate their Year 5 writing skills. The children will write: Instructions, narrative and a biography.</p>	<p>We will be focussing on developing our secure knowledge on Arithmetic and Fractions, Decimals and Percentages through a range of retrieval strategies as well as the calculation homework. For the first time, pupils will be taught how to draw and plot data on line graphs and understand how to read statistics from a line graph. Children will be taught how to plot coordinates on a graph and how to translate and reflect shapes on an axis. In Summer 2, children will continue to learn about decimals ranging from adding and subtracting decimals to dividing decimals by 10, 100 and 1000.</p>

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COMPUTING	DESIGN	ART
<p>In Computing this term, we will begin with 'Game Creator', this unit of work focuses on the children creating a 2D game with multiple levels, lives and scoring systems. They will then progress onto 3D modelling where they will create a 3D net of an object before printing this out and assembling it. We will then focus on using Microsoft Word and teaching the children edit a document including text formatting, tables, images and layouts.</p>	<p>In our final Design project, we will be making structures using dowel. The children will have to design and make a viewing tower for a human to observe poachers/ loggers in the Amazon rainforest. The children will be taught to measure twice and cut once in order to create a model of their 3D viewing tower They will be looking at different ways to join wood together and which shapes are most effectively for making stronger, longer lasting joins.</p>	<p>In Summer 2, linked to the History of the unit, children will create their own commemorative stamp linked to Richard III. They will understand how stamps are created and explore a variety of designs.</p>

MUSIC	R.E.	P.E.
<p>Our final units of Music will cover 20th Century music with particular focus on Jazz, Expressionism and Film music. The children will identify the features of each of these types of music before performing their own compositions. They will also complete their work on Voice which we began during our performance rehearsals.</p>	<p>In RE, we will be focussing on Christianity. Children will explore what the foundations of the religion is to a Christian by studying and understanding the importance of some of the commandments, to learn about parables and what they mean.</p>	<p>In the Summer term, we will be focusing on athletics which will be broken down into relays, throwing, hurdles and jumping. Children will develop their core strength to improve the distance covered and each week set their own targets for improvement.</p>
