ENGLISH		MATHS	
During the Summer term, we explore the picture book <i>Journey</i> and we use this as a writing stimulus. We look in greater depth at grammatical functions and rules and how to apply these to writing. After the half term, <i>The Viewer</i> is our class text; we investigate the use of evocative illustrations in order to establish tone and atmosphere. We use this tone and atmosphere in order write our own ghost stories.		As part of this term in mathematics, we will begin by consolidating our understanding of fractions, decimals and percentages and we will be introducing algebraic concepts. Within this term, we will also be exploring statistical representations, such as: pie charts and line graphs. In addition, we will continue to focus on our fluency in arithmetic.	
SCIENCE	HISTORY		GEOGRAPHY
In science, we will investigate light and how it can be used from a technological perspective. Later on in the term, we will develop an understanding of the concept of evolution and inheritance and delve deeper into the adaptions of plants and animals.	During this term, we undertaken two history units: Ancient Islamic Civilisations and a history comparison unit. In the first unit on Ancient Islamic Civilisations, we look at cultural impact, innovation, and inventions. In the second, we compare different historical periods and identify commonalities and differences.
